Step 1: Select a prescribed title.	Using Kialo

Step 4: Write your introduction.	Using Kialo

Step 5: Write an argument for your first AOK.	Using Kialo

Step 6: Evaluate a contrasting perspective.

Step 8: Repeat steps 5–7 for your second AOK.	Using Kialo

Step 9: Write your conclusion.	Using Kialo
